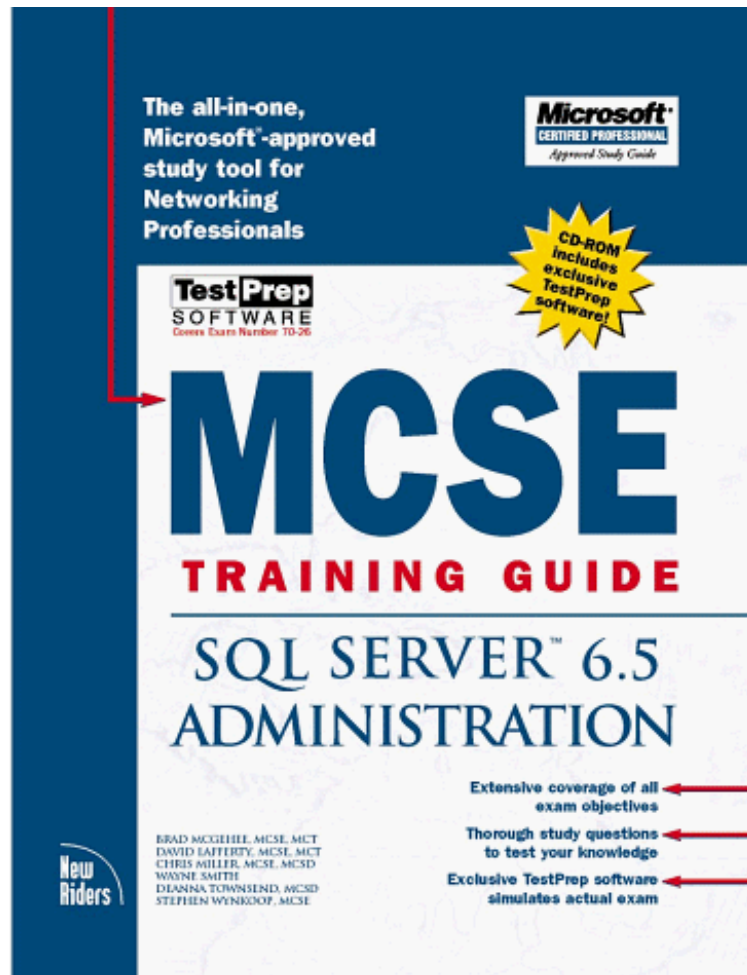

I have a couple year's experience with the product, but not 'in-depth', so there were several topics where I needed a good tutorial. This book filled that need and is written directly to the exam 'objectives'; problem is, I don't think the MS exam was reflective of the stated 'objectives'. So there were several questions on the exam that this book didn't prep well for (like application development and SQL OLE, DMF, ODS, etc, and replication--the publishing subscriber model wasn't even mentioned). But reading the corresponding MS documentation with each topic (a LOT of reading!) covers most of the bases. The practice exams

The good news is that the material is presented well enough so you can catch these mistakes. A clever ploy, perhaps? Other good news: the content is explicitly tied to the exam objectives, the exercises are worthwhile, several chapters are actually fun to read (e.g., Chapter 8:Managing Data), the chapter template is good (intro, content, exercises, review questions), and the authors frequently explain why something is the way it is.0 von 0 Kunden fanden die folgende Rezension hilfreich. Although I had SQL Server 6.5 support experience already, I was able to read the book and pass the SQL 6.5 administration exam nine weeks after purchasing the book, while working on a contract full time. In the exam, I found that only around 5% of the questions could not be answered from the material in the book. A tip: learn the SQL server configuration parameters listed at the end of Chapter 11 "Tuning and Monitoring".
